
Balwin School-You Belong Here!

What happens if my child is late or absent?


Students need to come in the main doors by the office and make sure they sign in before going to their classes. You can phone the office if your child will be absent or you can report their absence on SchoolZone.

Steps for a Parent to Report Student Absence in SchoolZone


- 1. The parent logs into SchoolZone.
- 2. The parent clicks on Student Profile.

Bicycles and other wheeled devices

Students may bring their bicycles to school as long as they lock them up. Students must not ride their bicycles on the school grounds during school hours. The school is not responsible for any items stolen if not locked up. Roller blades, heelys, scooters and skateboards are not to be used on school property during school hours.

Weather and Students Going Outside

Recess and fresh air is an important break from the regular school routine and gives students a chance to get fresh air and exercise. Balwin will have morning and afternoon recess breaks for elementary students and a lunch break for all students, in most weather so students should dress appropriately.

Students will be provided access to the school building a minimum of 15 minutes prior to the morning instructional periods when there is poor weather. A large green circle will be displayed on entry doors letting students and families know that they will be let into the building early due to the following weather conditions:

- it's raining heavily, lightning, or there are dangerous winds
- temperatures drop to -23 degrees Celsius
- on days when Environment Canada issues an Air Quality Health Index rating that is at 7 or higher

The Basics

Families, please review all the Apps your child is using on their devices. Talk about their responsibilities, safety and the safety of others.



Personal devices of any kind are not allowed in classrooms during instruction.

Junior High students can access their devices at the morning break time and at lunch.

Elementary students who bring devices to school (we discourage this) are not allowed to use it at all during the day (not at recess and not at lunch).

Do you know what apps your child is using and why?

The provincial government has said the minimum standards will be in place for the start of the 2024-25 school year to:

- ensure personal mobile devices and social media do not disrupt learning
- reduce distractions and bullying maximize learning time
 - support student mental health

Basics Continued

- Balwin is a **CLOSED CAMPUS** for lunch. Students are not allowed to leave school property.
- Balwin is a HOODS DOWN school.
- No Food delivery services (Skip the Dishes, Uber Eats, etc.) are allowed at Balwin.



We DO NOT have a daily lunch program this year.

We are working on creating a healthy snack program to assist students who forget their lunch or who are not able to bring one. ***Please contact Mrs. Mathew if you are having challenges with providing a lunch for your child.



We DO have a morning meal program that runs from 8 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.

Respectful Clothing

Balwin School expects students and staff to dress in a manner that is consistent with respectful work environments. Students should be dressed comfortably and professionally, and the following guidelines apply:

- No bandanas (headwear of a religious nature may be worn)
- No offensive language, pictures or insinuations on clothing
- No images of weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, e-cigarettes or inhalants
- No images, language or symbols of gang activity
 If a student comes to school inappropriately dressed, they will be lent clothing that meets the dress code or sent home to change once parents or guardians are notified.



Grade 9 Farewell

Grade 9 students need to have 90% attendance to qualify to attend the Grade 9 Farewell Celebration at the end of the year. This includes both absences and lates. Attendance will be monitored each semester and a list of students who may attend the farewell will be posted at the end of reporting periods two and three. Students can earn their way back onto the farewell celebration list by making and following through on an attendance contract with their homeroom teacher.

LOCKERS

Teachers will assign lockers for student individual use. Students must use a combination lock. They are responsible for the security and tidiness of their locker. All personal items and books are to be kept in their own locker. Students are not to tamper with locks or lockers and should not give their combination to other students, not even friends. Students should get books and other materials from their locker before morning classes, at lunch and then before afternoon classes. At the school's discretion lockers may be searched.
