

School Fees

These fees are posted in accordance with Sections 6 & 7 of the Education Act School Fees Regulation (Alberta Regulation 95/2019).

The list below includes every school fee that may be charged for every grade. It is important to note that you would only have to pay for items applicable to your child and that some fees may be lower than projected.

At the commencement of classes, we will confirm your fees with you and explain what they are for. Where fees cover consumable supplies, families have the option of bringing their own supplies of similar quality and specifications in lieu of paying that portion of the fees.




School Staff supervise before school beginning at 8:13

School Staff supervise for 10 minutes after school until 3:25 for elementary and until 3:26 for junior high.

On Thursdays, dismissal is 2:15 for elementary and supervision is until 2:25.

On Thursdays, dismissal is 2:05 for junior high and supervision is until 2:15.





Arriving at School Late or Leaving
School Early



Lates: If your child arrives to school late, they MUST sign in at the main office.

Leaving early: If your child needs to leave school for an appointment or for illness, we need a parent to let us know.

Depending on the age of your child, we ask that they are signed out by a parent or that they sign themselves out before they leave.

In all cases, we must have direct communication with a parent/guardian.

Positive Behaviour Expectations at Balwin

Personal devices of any kind are not allowed in classrooms during instruction.

Devices will be locked in secure lock boxes for each homeroom.

Junior High students can access their devices at lunch.

Elementary students who bring devices to school (we discourage this) are not allowed to use them at all during the day (not at recess or at lunch).

The provincial government has set these minimum standards for the school year to:

- ensure personal mobile devices and social media do not disrupt learning
- reduce distractions and bullying
- maximize learning time
- support student mental health



Do you know what apps your child is using and why?

We Rely on Parents as Partners!

Please keep track of the electronic apps your child is using and why. Have them update you on their passwords and make sure you are able to access their devices. This will help us all support them in the digital choices they make and in social relationships further down the road.



- Balwin is a CLOSED CAMPUS for lunch. Students are NOT allowed to leave school property.
- Balwin is a **HOODS DOWN** school.

 Food delivery services (Skip the Dishes, Uber Eats, etc.) are NOT allowed at Balwin.

Respectful Clothing

Balwin School expects students and staff to dress in a manner that is consistent with respectful work environments.

Students should be dressed comfortably and professionally, and the following guidelines apply:

- No bandanas (headwear of a religious nature may be worn)
- No offensive language, pictures or insinuations on clothing
- No images of weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol, e-cigarettes or inhalants
- No images, language or symbols of gang activity

If a student comes to school inappropriately dressed, they will be lent clothing that meets the dress code or sent home to change once parents or guardians are notified.



Weather



Schools need to remain open even under the most severe weather conditions to provide a safe environment for students who choose to attend. It is up to parents to decide whether or not to send their child to school on days with severe weather—parents should inform schools if they choose to keep their child home.

Bad Weather and Recess

Recess is an important break from the regular school routine and gives students a chance to get fresh air and exercise. Schools will continue to have morning and afternoon recess breaks, even in bad weather so students should dress appropriately.

Students will only be kept inside during recess if:

- it's raining heavily
- temperatures drop to -23 degrees Celsius
- the AQHI reaches 7 (air quality)
- a heat warning has been issued

Morning Meal Program

We have a morning meal program daily that is open and available to all students.

The morning meal program runs from 8 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.

Bicycles and Other Wheeled Devices

Students may bring their bicycles to school as long as they lock them up. Students must not ride their bicycles on the school grounds during school hours. The school is not responsible for any items stolen if not locked up. Roller blades, heelys, scooters and skateboards are not to be used on school property during school hours.



Elementary After School Sports Program

Registration is OPEN for students in Grades 3, 4, and 5 attending participating schools, for the 2025-26 school year.

Grade 9 Farewell

Grade 9 students need to have 90% attendance to qualify to attend the Grade 9 Farewell Celebration at the end of the year. This includes both absences and lates. Attendance will be monitored each semester. Students can earn their way back onto the farewell celebration list by making and following through on an attendance contract with their homeroom teacher.

LOCKERS

Teachers will assign lockers for student individual use. Students must use a combination lock. They are responsible for the security and tidiness of their locker. All personal items and books are to be kept in their own locker. Students are not to tamper with locks or lockers and should not give their combination to other students, not even friends. Students need to get books and other materials from their locker before morning classes, at lunch and then before afternoon classes. At the school's discretion lockers may be searched.
